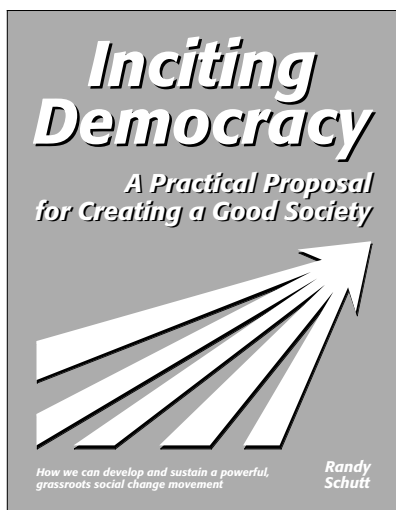
Inciting Democracy is a comprehensive and practical book about grassroots organizing that is loaded with information and resources.
